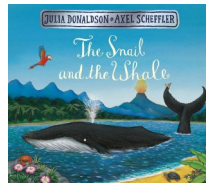
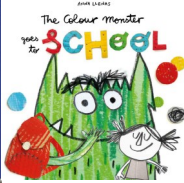
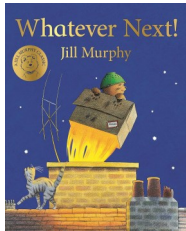
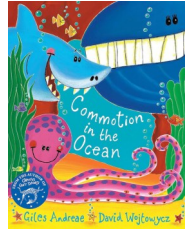
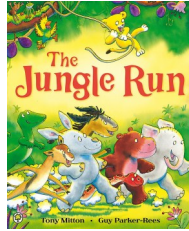
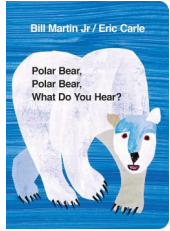
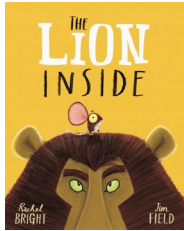


FS1—Knowledge Organiser: Summer 2

Supporting learning and development at home

Talking Tips

Talk about activities and events as they are happening. Everyday activities provide wonderful learning opportunities, for example, naming food items as you unpack the shopping or talking about what you are doing as you clean.

Show your child how to say it correctly. Children make mistakes. Show them how to do it rather than telling them they have got it wrong. For example, "I runned to the park."...."Yes, you ran to the park."

Offer your child choices. Hold up the choices that are available and name them. This will help your child to learn more words. For example, "orange juice or blackcurrant juice?"

Some of the vocabulary we will be exploring

Climate The weather conditions in a certain area.

Map A drawing or picture of all or part of the Earth's surface showing features such as rivers, lakes, forests, buildings and roads.

Habitat The natural environment where a plant or animal lives.

Gravity A force that pulls things to the centre of the Earth.

Shining Showing our shining selves means we sit still, in our own space, hands in our laps, not touching anyone else and eyes on the talker. This helps us to do our best learning during carpet times.

Kind Hands A term used in Hedgehog Class to promote kindness, sharing and being gentle.

Possible experiences

- Talk about and describe different animals through play, craft and sorting games
- Learn new songs and practice familiar ones to perform to parents at the next stay and play

Possible experiences
